for our prayer

Remember **Gillian** and **Michael Brown** following the passing away of her father – for good support & the Lord’s comfort.

Alastair Brown writes: *I shall be travelling to Kazakhstan on 6 September and there until 11 September as one of a team of independent experts appointed by the Group of States against Corruption (“GRECO”), which Kazakhstan has recently joined, as part of the process of mutual evaluation of the anti-corruption law and practice of member states against the internationally agreed standards which they have, by joining GRECO, agreed to accept. The team will consist of four people (one from Portugal, one from Lithuania, one from Romania, and me) supported by two members of the GRECO Secretariat.*

In preparation for the visit, we have been studying materials about Kazakhstan’s response to corruption and, during the visit, we will be exploring issues which arise out of that in meetings with Government ministers and officials, judges, law enforcement officers, prosecutors, defence lawyers, and representatives of civil society (especially the anti-corruption NGO Transparency International). My particular responsibilities will be in relation to money laundering, confiscation of the proceeds of corruption, and the connection between corruption and organised crime. After the country visit, we will collaborate on the preparation of a report with recommendations. We will present that in draft early next year at a plenary meeting of the 50 member states of GRECO. Once the recommendations are finalised and adopted by that plenary meeting, the member state under evaluation has a treaty obligation to implement them.

It should be emphasised that this is a process of mutual evaluation by equals. The UK has been evaluated on 5 occasions.

Prayer points:

Smooth travel – I have to transit through Frankfurt and satisfy the COVID related requirements of both the EU and Kazakhstan, including a PCR test to be taken within 72 hours before arrival in Kazakhstan and which I also need to be allowed to fly to Frankfurt. My appointment is 62 hours before I’m due to reach Kazakhstan and 48 hours before I’m due to board the flight to Frankfurt. The provider “aims” to deliver results “normally” within 48 hours. The window feels a little tight. I need another test before I fly home (to satisfy Germany) and another one 2 days after return (to satisfy the UK).

Good relations within the team – This is usually not a problem; but occasionally someone is difficult. Since we have to work closely together all week and produce a joint report, it helps if we can make relationships work.

Wisdom and sensitivity – Kazakhstan is heading in the right direction but still has significant problems. We need to make the visit helpful to them. Eastern European countries tend to be

a bit defensive when confronted with western Europeans telling them what to do. We need to get alongside them and show respect.

Mandy and Bishop Andy Lines. Andy writes: *Following a dental visit and a routine blood test with our general practitioner, Mandy has been diagnosed with Myeloma - a blood cancer that is treatable but not curable; there has been a battery of tests at two London hospitals, and there is still considerable uncertainty as to type, extent, and treatment. We are currently self-isolating and on Friday Mandy goes for a second of three biopsies, this time on a lesion on her jaw to ascertain whether this is linked to the Myeloma. Whatever transpires she will need to start treatment which will include chemo/ radiotherapy & eventually stem cell transplant, all over next 4-6 months. So, we are just trying to process what it is all going to mean: changing plans and altered dates for moving, along with the issue of what to communicate and to whom. Strangely, Mandy feels well but knows that the treatment will change that.*

F@ST Club is scheduled to begin again next Friday afternoon (27 August). Pray for the team as they prepare and that we see a good number of young people come along.

For **young people** as they return to nursery or school – for safety, peace, and care for others.

Pray for **Tiffany Butler**, who arrives from the United States on Friday 20 August. She will be studying at Edinburgh University – for safe travel, good health, and that she will quickly feel at home in Scotland.

Pray for **Stuart and Jenny Robertson** following Stuart's stroke a few weeks ago. Stuart was curate at St Ts' from 1978-81.

Pray for **Rose**, our cleaner Rose's mother – for comfort and healing.
