We wanted to thank you all for your continued prayers and messages of support, and to let you have an update on Paul's treatment.
He had an appointment with the consultant on Wednesday, following a CT Scan a couple of weeks ago. Dr Napier is very pleased with Paul's progress and continues to be surprised at how well he is tolerating the chemotherapy. All is going in the right direction, and the scan showed that the tumour on the pancreas had reduced in size, as had the tumours on the liver, where there were also signs of regeneration of normal tissue. Following the appointment with the oncologist, Paul proceeded to have treatment number 8 – the plan is to continue for 12 treatments and then have another scan. The idea of continuing beyond 12 is also a possibility if Paul's bone marrow and blood tests indicate he could tolerate further treatment. We are so thankful, and praise God for answered prayers.
