

New Constitution

As previously explained at the general meeting on 14th October, the new constitution that was presented to that meeting will be the basis of a new church to be known as St Thomas Church. As a direct result of that meeting we have made some changes to the draft constitution, and the copies of the final version are available this morning. Email copies were sent out to all Green Card members. If you didn't get a copy please let Jane know and it can be resent.

The next stage is to take the new constitution to the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator for their agreement.

As part of this process, the Vestry and Trustees have planned a vote for 'green card' members on Sunday 25th November after the service. At this meeting members will be invited to vote on the following proposition:

"I am in favour of the establishment of an independent Anglican church to be known as St Thomas Church."
