The Trinity underpins our faith, and it is the Trinity that calls us, makes us holy and helps us respond to, and obey, the Lord Jesus.

We've been reminded this week of human sin in so many ways. The death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, the resulting protests and the dangerous rhetoric and posturing of leaders point to this. At a local level, you might have observed people breaking the social distancing rules (a lot!), littering (a certain fast food chain opened this week – the following morning you could find the remnants of takeaway food in many public places) and I heard of a mum with a new baby being assaulted by someone in a local store who wanted to buy up all the formula milk. There have been many acts of kindness, we've enjoyed clapping the NHS/carers and neighbours have looked out for one another. All of that is good.

Yet, we know that in our hearts human beings are selfish and prone to worshipping idols. God - the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit - work together to reveal our broken sinful humanity, convict us of our need for forgiveness and lead us to repentance. They help us walk with God in relationship and remind us constantly that we have a wonderful Gospel to share with family, friends and neighbours. The Trinity also speaks to us of relationship – if we are made in the image of God then we are built to be in relationship. That's why for many of us, isolation has been hard. But now we can begin to see one another, albeit at a social distance. Let's begin to enjoy relationships like that again but lets us not forget our lifegiving and sustaining relationship with God. He is with us for the long haul ahead.
