Prayer for 3rd Sunday in Lent

Almighty God, you know that we have no power in ourselves to help ourselves: Keep us both outwardly in our bodies and inwardly in our souls, that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Praise and Thanksgiving

Thank God for His presence, for hearing our prayers, for sharing his heart with us.

Thank God for the work of the police and the courts for their dedication to peace and justice. Thank Him that they are willing to do a job that is often sacrificial and challenging.

Ask that even as you are praying, God will pour out his Spirit across our land.

Pray for good governance from political leaders both locally and nationally – that their words will be true and their actions have integrity.

Give thanks and pray for those who care for others as part of the NHS, care homes and in our own homes – pray for protection, provision of resources and respite from the pressures of this last year.

Give thanks for the rollout of vaccines – pray for continued progress and that there will be equitable distribution of vaccines around the world.

Pray for our friends at Westhill Community Church as they seek completion of their hopes to join with us in the Anglican Convocation in Europe – for Anne Dyer, Bishop of Aberdeen that she will speak and for the vestry of the ‘old’ congregation who are negotiating with the diocese: that all will speak and act with love and integrity and that an end will be in sight. Pray too for the ‘new’ vestry elected to serve the new leadership of the congregation: for renewed vision and energy.

Pray for our own AGM – for new members of vestry to be called, giving thanks for those who have served us so faithfully over the years. Give thanks for the Lord’s continuing resources for mission and ministry.

Pray for Jane and Gordon Ross as they plan a future in Hoylake – for a new home and good preparations. Give thanks for Jane’s faithful service to God’s people over many years and pray for fresh blessing in a new season.
